Perform required security inventories. Store protective service gear and equipment. Store protective service vehicle. Operate computer software programs.</p>	200

Identify members of a Protective Service detail. Identify mission requirements in a Tactical area. Perform Protective Services Motorcade Operations. Perform precision vehicle operations. Supervise protective service movements. Demonstrate unarmed defense techniques against an attack. Engage identified targets with assigned weapon under physical stress.
